Thought - Change

This reading starts our theme of change. Our beings are described as becoming places of exultation, joy, exuberance, delight in God. We will have new clothes that show God's saving love and robes of justice. We will wear new jewels and garlands. New shoots will be springing from the earth and gardens will be transformed


I'm sure over Christmas we have seen much change. Beautifully wrapped parcels converted into toys or chocolates and a heap of wrappings. Individual bewildering jigsaw pieces becoming unbelievable pictures. Delicious ingredients transformed into scrumptious delights. Which in turn become empty plates and piles of washing up.

Over this last year there has been so much change, so much difficulty, so much sadness, so much newness, so much determination, so much creativity.

If we return to this reading, we hear that as we take each step alongside God, through the changes around us, our glory shall shine out and the Lord will give us each a new name. We shall be a crown of beauty and in the hand of the Lord, a royal diadem, now and for ever

So, for a few minutes let this sink in. Imagine the beauty of snowflakes growing. Imagine the amazing changes God has and will make in us.

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Reading 2 - Luke 2:22-40 NRSV Jesus Is Presented in the Temple

²² When the time came for their purification according to the law of Moses, they brought him up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord ²³ (as it is written in the law of the Lord, "Every firstborn male shall be designated as holy to the Lord"), 24 and they offered a sacrifice according to what is stated in the law of the Lord, "a pair of turtledoves or two young pigeons." ²⁵ Now there was a man in Jerusalem whose name was Simeon; [a] this man was righteous and devout, looking forward to the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit rested on him. ²⁶ It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not see death before he had seen the Lord's Messiah. [b] 27 Guided by the Spirit, Simeon came into the temple; and when the parents brought in the child Jesus, to do for him what was customary under the law, ²⁸ Simeon^[d] took him in his arms and praised God, saying,

²⁹ "Master, now you are dismissing your servant^[e] in peace,

according to your word;

³⁰ for my eyes have seen your salvation,

which you have prepared in the presence of all peoples,

³² a light for revelation to the Gentiles and for glory to your people Israel."

33 And the child's father and mother were amazed at what was being said about him. 34 Then Simeon blessed them and said to his mother Mary, "This child is destined for the falling and the rising of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be opposed ³⁵ so that the inner thoughts of many will be revealed—and a sword will pierce your own soul too." ³⁶ There was also a prophet, Anna^[g] the daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Asher. She was of a great age, having lived with her husband seven years after her marriage, ³⁷ then as a widow to the age of eighty-four. She never left the temple but worshiped there with fasting and prayer night and day. ³⁸ At that moment she came, and began to praise God and to speak about the child to all who were looking for the redemption of Jerusalem.

The Return to Nazareth

³⁹ When they had finished everything required by the law of the Lord, they returned to Galilee, to their own town of Nazareth. ⁴⁰ The child grew and became strong, filled with wisdom; and the favour of God was upon him.

Reflection We began with change. Now we hear of the changes brought by the tiny baby Jesus as he is brought into the Temple to be presented, as is the Jewish custom.

We hear that Simeon is changed by the encouragement of the Holy Spirit. He is changed by

holding this child and he praises God, revealing that in this scrap of humanity - God is securing our future and bringing light for everyone. But this will not be easy. We hear that Anna is changed, as her endless days of dedication are rewarded by seeing this child and shares the changed possibilities this child brings.

Neither Simeon or Anna are young. We are clearly shown the importance of their age, their experience, their year in year out dedication. We are reminded of the value of all our generations - the experienced, the new and fresh, the in the middle of it, the weary and worn, those with time, those who can show us the way whether old or young.

We need each other in worshipping, working, serving, grieving, caring, loving. God has put us in community, to support, encourage, delight, surprise, and challenge, through whatever changes life throws at us, as we step out into this New Year, with God in the middle of us all. God our creator, our redeemer, our inspiration.

Let's share together the words of the song, 'Lean on me'. My boys used to sing this in their school choir. This version on YouTube -
